Elite Scholarship to study at Department of Taiwanese Literature, NCKU 2022 FALL Admission for International Degree Students

Eligibility:

Qualification of international students who are Doctoral/Master degreeseeking applicants, and currently are university lecturers or professors in Vietnam, Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines, India, Malaysia, Singapore, Brunei, Myanmar, Cambodia, Laos. *Lecturer Certificate (English version) is needed.

Study year:

Commencing from 2022 Fall Semester

Amount of scholarship:

NTD 300,000/per year

(Around USD 10,000/per year; exchange rate: NTD to USD is 30 to 1) *The amount of Elite scholarship is issued by MOE, and it will be NTD 25,000 per month, which is used as funding to your tuition fee and credit fee, and the rest amount is used as monthly stipend to support your studying and living in NCKU. ** Duration of scholarships: 3 years for PhD program 2 years for master program (reviewed

** Duration of scholarships: 3 years for PhD program, 2 years for master program (reviewed annually).

In addition to this scholarship, you may also work as a TA/RA for additional stipend.

How to apply?

- First round: Please send us your CV, research plan (1 page) and lecture certificate in English or Taiwanese/Chinese by the deadline of September 25th, 2021. You will be promoted to second round if you pass the review.
- Second round: You are invited to submit an official application to the admission for 2022 Fall semester. You will be granted the scholarship and admission if your application is approved.

Introduction to the Department of Taiwanese Literature!

Graduate program (MA & PhD) for international students of the Department of Taiwanese Literature is divided into two divisions:

A) Division for Taiwanese Literature Studies.

B) Division for Taiwan and Southeast Asian Studies. This is a new division started in Fall 2019. The courses offered to the students in this division are mainly in English or bilingual (English





plus Taiwanese or Chinese). Moreover, students may take courses which are taught in English and offered by other departments in the College of Liberal Arts. Those prospective students who want to do research on Southeast Asia or a comparative study of Taiwan and Southeast Asia are encourage to apply for this division. This division covers a wide range of research areas such as linguistics, language teaching, literature, culture, gender, history, arts, religions, anthropology and archaeology

Departmental Requirements

1. Graduate program (MA & PhD) for international students of the Department of Taiwanese Literature is divided into two divisions:

- a. Division for Taiwanese Literature Studies. In this division, the courses offered to the students are mainly in Chinese and Taiwanese.
- b. Division for Taiwan and Southeast Asian Studies. The courses offered to the students in this division are mainly in English or bilingual. Moreover, students may take courses which are taught in English and offered by other departments in the College of Liberal Arts.

2. Applicants may be interviewed by phone or webcam. If so, the Department will inform the applicants in advance.

3. Applicants from non-English speaking countries are required to provide English proficiency certificate (such as TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS or GEPT). Division B require higher English abilities than division A.

4. The English proficiency certificate is not required for applicants whose previous degree is from an English-speaking country (Australia · Canada · United Kingdom · Ireland · New Zealand · South Africa or the United States of America) but the applicant has to offer the diploma as proof.

- 5. Applicants for PhD should provide a thesis of master and other related publications.
- 6. Applicants for **division A** must fulfill the following additional requirements:
- a. Applicants must possess advanced Chinese skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Applicants are required to provide Chinese proficiency certificate (TOCFL or New





HSK or relevant Chinese language certificates).

- b. Applicants are required to provide research plan, CV, autobiography and other helpful documents in Chinese (or Taiwanese) for admission review.
- **7**. Applicants for **division B** must fulfill the following additional requirements:
- a. Applicants must possess advanced English skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Applicants are required to provide English proficiency certificate (such as TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS or GEPT).
- b. Applicants are required to provide research plan, CV, autobiography and other helpful documents in English for admission review.

Graduation Requirements (for Master degrees)

- 1. Credits required for graduation will be at least 33 credits plus additional MA thesis 6 credits
- Required professional courses 3 credits
- Elective professional courses 30 credits
- 2. Language skill identification is required for graduation, including two categories:
- The first language category: Include Taiwanese, Hakka, aboriginal languages, and Chinese.

Student must choose one of these four language identifications to complete the degree.

- The second language category: M.A. student must choose a foreign language identification to complete the degree.

3. At least a conference or journal paper is published

4. You need to participate at least four academic conferences or workshops, providing reports (each for over one thousand words) and recognized by the Committee of Learning.

- 5. Defense for thesis proposal
- 6. Final defense for thesis

Graduation Requirements (for PhD degrees)

1. Credits required for graduation will be at least 24 credits plus additional Ph.D dissertation 12 credits

- Required professional courses 6 credits
- Elective professional courses 18 credits
- 2. Language skill identification is required for graduation, including two categories:
- The first language category: Include Taiwanese, Hakka, aboriginal languages, and Chinese.

Student must choose one to two of these four language identifications to complete the degree. The language identifying standards are that one must pass the high level and the other the basic level.

- The second language category: Student must choose one to two foreign language identifications to complete the degree. The language identifying standards are that one must pass the high level and the other the basic level. This foreign language category includes foreign student's native languages.

3. Ph.D students must publish one paper on Taiwan/foreign journal (must attach the examined certification) and at least two papers on Taiwan/foreign academic seminar. (must attach acceptance letter or agenda)

4. Qualifying exam: Students may take the exam up to only two times

5. Defense for dissertation proposal

6. Final defense for dissertation


